Chair Marcoux called the meeting to order at 7:36 a.m.

Motion by Shuman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mrotek, to approve the agenda. Motion carried

Motion by Mrotek, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hoff, to approve the minutes of the November 26, 2018 meeting.  
Motion carried.

Justice Point presented a power point report at the November 26 meeting and will provide a refined report this week.

The Council discussed diversion court for first time offenders. Law enforcement would use a three-question proxy in the field to determine referring the individual to the Criminal Justice Coordinator. This process will need coordination with the various law enforcement entities covering Sawyer County. Sawyer County will continue to collect data on jail inmates.

The Council discussed including the Criminal Justice Coordinator on the Council as a voting member. The coordinator is a hired employee who carries out the mission of the Council and works with the Chair regarding agenda items. The consensus of the Council was the coordinator should sit at the table as a non-voting member of the council.

The Committee discussed a county resolution to adopt state statutes as ordinances. This would allow Sawyer County officers to issue a citation for violating a county ordinance rather than issuing a criminal charge. Motion by Shuman, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Yackel, to move the resolution to adopt state statutes to Public Safety for review. Motion carried

Joint Jurisdiction – LCO Grant will be on the next agenda.

The LCO Tribal Council signed the Joint Sawyer County / Lac Courte Oreilles MOU. The MOU calls for two LCO Tribal Council members sitting on the CJCC. Language in the MOU states LCO is contributing \$25,000 toward the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. The CJCC requests the language state LCO is contributing \$25,000 to support the Criminal Justice Coordinator position. Tribal Representative Tweed Shuman will present the MOU to the LCO Tribal Council for a change in the language. The CJCC will revise the bylaws to include two

LCO Tribal Council members on the Council. Motion by Hoff, 2<sup>nd</sup> by McCoy, to approve the MOU and move it to Public Safety with the understanding the \$25,000 contribution from LCO is for the Criminal Justice Coordinator position. Motion carried

The Council discussed the State Judge Bill moving forward and what a second circuit court judge means to Sawyer County. A second judge requires a second courtroom with a jury room. Additions to the current Courthouse require fire suppression throughout the Courthouse. Could add on to the jail. Funding for building could come from bonding. This would be outside the levy limits and would increase taxes. Operating costs could range from \$200,000 to \$400,000 depending on support staff and additional Assistant District Attorneys. Alternative may be different court hours and using Court Commissioners. Supervisor McCoy suggested an advisory referendum on the April Ballot. This is on the Public Safety agenda with representation from the State of Wisconsin.

Sajdera informed the Council the jail is using electronic monitoring with two inmates and it is working very well. Electronic monitoring costs the inmate \$20.00 per day.
