



Northwest Wisconsin Historic and Projected Population and Labor Force





Age Distribution of Northwest Wisconsin Residents





NW Wisconsin Population & Labor Force by Age in 2000





NW Education by Age Group






Nonfarm jobs in Northwest Wisconsin: 2004


Projected Job Growth by Industry 2002-2012



Total projected increase - 8,250 jobs



Projected Job Openings by Occupation in Northwest WI 2002 - 2012



Occupation group distribution: 2004






Population Density Changes in the Wisconsin Region

(Persons per Square Mile)



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




Percentage Population Change by Decade 1900 – 2000




Components of Population Change in Sawyer County: 1990-2000



Population Age 65 and Over - Percent of Census Block Group in 2000




Percent of Population Age 65 or Over
(by Census Block Group in 2000)








Projected Population Change Sawyer County: 2000-2030 *(from 16,196 to 18,282)*

Wisconsin Regional Per Capita Incomes by Census Block Group (Shown as Percentage of the National Per Capita Income)










Personal Income Components Sawyer County 2002



Average Household Wage and Salary Income by Census Block Group (Shown as Percentage of the National Average Wage and Salary Income)




Average Household Wage by Block Group (as % of National Avg. Household Wage)








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Households with Retirement Income in the Wisconsin Region

(Percentage of Households by Census Block Group)







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Households with Social Security Income in the Wisconsin Region (Percentage of Households by Census Block Group)





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

Average Round Trip Commuting Distance per Driving Worker (n = 2,406,303 in WI) (by Census Tract of Worker Residence)








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Seasonal and Recreational Housing Units (Percentage of all Housing Units by Census Block Group)






