Call to Order – Chair Marc Helwig called the meeting to order at 8:30 am.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met. Roll Call was taken; a quorum was met.

Meeting Agenda –

Public Comments – Linda Zillmer

Minutes from the previous meeting – A motion was made by Mr. Boettcher to approve the minutes of the July 13, 2022, second by Mr. Peters. Motion carried without negative vote.

Events –

Land Records and County Surveyor Department Report – Mr. Ploegger was unable to attend.

Review Board Policy & Procedure Manual Updates – Mr. Albarado added minor changes that will move to the County Board meeting.

Sawyer County Forestry Department Report – A Motorized Trails report was provided by Ms. LaReau. The Alliance plans to purchase more counters and are starting trail maintenance. Updating of signage is underway. They have applied for a grant for a Pavilion on the Tuscobia Trail and have received the award. Ron Burgen reported on non-motorized trails and there are ongoing rehab efforts to maintain some of our older trails.

County Forestry Report – A written report was provided and reviewed by Mr. Peterson. There has been a recent slow start in sales but he anticipates it will pick up. The DNR will likely be doing a flight to address Oak Wilt sections.

DNR Forestry Report – A written report was provided and reviewed by Mr. Zubrod. This will be the last year that the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation will be raffling off a tag.

Proposal to allow Class I E-Bikes – Mr. Peterson reported that we've been requested to do a trial on allowing E-Bikes on the trails. Mr. Burgen advised that the use of E-Bikes is growing and opening the sport to more people. The proposal is only for Class I E-Bikes that has a small electric motor and aids the rider while peddling only; top end is 20-mph while peddling. They are seeking approval for a one-year trial. A motion was made to approve a one-year trial period to include Class I E-Bikes on the trail by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Weaver. Motion carried without negative vote.

Sawyer County Forest Comprehensive Land Use Plan Final Draft – Mr. Peterson advised that he has submitted this plan to the DNR for review and has a summary sheet of suggested changes that came out of the review. A motion was made by Mr. Peters; second by Mr. Boettcher to approve the Resolution for Approval of the 2021-2035 Sawyer County Comprehensive Land Use Plan and forward to County Board. Motion carried without negative vote.

Closed Session – At 9:16 am a motion was made by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Helwig to enter closed session for Trail Right-of-Way for the purpose of deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public lands, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive bargaining reasons require a closed session. A roll call vote was taken and proceeded with all “aye” votes from Boettcher, Peters, Helwig, Weaver, Bisonette and Sheptick. Present were Mr. Peterson and Mr. Kozlowski. All virtual members certified they were alone and in a closed room.

At 9:53 am, a motion was made by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Helwig to enter open session at 9:53 am. Motion carried without negative vote. No action was taken on this item.

Closed Session Cooper Property – At 9:54 am, a motion was made by Mr. Helwig; second by Mr. Boettcher to enter closed session for the purpose of deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public lands, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive bargaining reasons require a closed session. A roll call vote was taken and proceeded with all “aye” votes from Boettcher, Peters, Helwig, Weaver, Bisonette and Sheptick. A motion was made at 10:10 am to enter open session by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Peters. Motion carried without negative vote.

Zoning/Conservation Department Report – Mr. Kozlowski advised they are doing shoreline mitigation agreements and property checks; the tree and shrub sale order is out for next year and available on our website.

Nelson Lake Drawdown Proposal – Mr. Kozlowski presented the proposal to drawdown the Nelson Lake Dam at the recommendation of the DNR for an ongoing, every-other-year drawdown proposal for the next five years. A motion was made by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Peters to approve the request. Motion carried without negative vote.

USDA Report – Mr. Sheptick provided an oral report with upcoming deadlines.

LCO Report – Mr. Bisonette advised that they are completing a number of habitat improvement programs. Their staff has been working on mitigating Milfoil on area lakes with an eco-harvester using a watercraft combine.

Carbon tax update – Closed Session – At 10:19 am a motion was made by Mr. Helwig; second by Mr. Sheptick to enter closed session for the purpose of deliberating or negotiating the purchasing of public properties, the investing of public lands, or conducting other specified public business, whenever competitive bargaining reasons require a closed session. A roll call vote was taken and proceeded with all “aye” votes from Boettcher, Peters, Helwig, Weaver, Bisonette and Sheptick. At 10:23 am a motion was made by Mr. Boettcher; second by Mr. Helwig to enter open session. Motion carried without negative vote. No action was taken on this item and it will return to the September meeting.

DNR Forestry Report for August 2022

Forestry:

Forest Certification Audit: The following is a summary of DRAFT findings from the 2022 SFI and FSC surveillance audit done in Florence, Forest, Marinette, and Oconto counties:

SFI – 2022

NO CARS

Opportunities for Improvements (OFI) – OFI 2022-01: There is an opportunity to improve understanding of SFI’s “Special Sites” designation.

Sawyer County will look for opportunities to identify and document areas and/or follow recommendations from WCFA Certification Committee.

FSC – 2022

2 MINOR CARS – Specific to only Oconto County for addressing, but good opportunity for all FSC Counties to review clear language in the 15-year plan regarding clearly stating/description of HCVF’s on the property.

Sawyer County has addressed in section 830.1 of section 830 Exceptional Resources, Unique Areas of the 2021-2035 Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

Discussions on the certification audit will take place at the WCFA legislative/certification committee meeting to be held on Tuesday, September 27th at the Waters in Minocqua, WI. Final report will be released later. Sawyer County is scheduled for audit in 2023.

Wildlife:

Elk Calving Study: This subject is a follow-up regarding a question from the August meeting. The study is scheduled for three years. The purpose is to determine what percentage of calves make it to one year of age. This past summer DNR wildlife staff were able to attach collars to eleven calves. Study is in early stages and there is not enough data to draw conclusions.

Conservation Department Update August 2022 – September 2022

- Purple Loosestrife Control near Nelson Lake
- 1 Eurasian Water Milfoil area on Big Sissabagama that we are monitoring and attempting to eradicate.
- Stop log removal and dewatering of Lake Loretta in conjunction with the Upper Brunet River Dam Project has begun. We are now looking at a 6” drawdown per day with full drawdown to be completed by September 25th, 2022.
- Discussion held with DNR regarding Callahan Dam. Updates to follow
- Float bog near Nelson Lake Dam. Waiting for a good North wind and then attempting to remove.
