

Wisconsin Well Woman Medicaid

You may be able to enroll in Wisconsin Well Woman Medicaid if you are enrolled in Family Planning Only Services and:

- Are screened for, and diagnosed with, cervical cancer or a precancerous condition of the cervix, or
- Receive a clinical breast exam through Family Planning Only Services and through follow up medical testing outside of Family Planning Only Services are diagnosed with breast cancer, and
- Are found to be in need of treatment for breast or cervical cancer or a precancerous cervical condition.



Wisconsin Well Woman Medicaid covers the same services a Regular Badger Care Plus

Family Planning Only Services

Program Information and How to Apply for Coverage

The Primary Purpose of the Family Planning Only Services Program is to provide certain family planning—related services to prevent unplanned pregnancies. This coverage is for both men and women. Covered services are limited to family planning and related services like testing and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases/infections (STDs/STIs).

To enroll you must:

- Be a US citizen or have a qualifying immigration status,
- Be of child bearing or reproductive age,
- Not be getting Medicaid for the Elderly, Blind or Disabled or Badger Care Plus, and
- Have at or below \$2,942.50 per month,
 - ◆ Only your own income is counted for this program.
 - ◆ Assets are not counted.
- Program income limits are based on federal guidelines, which may increase by a small amount each year

Note: You can have private health insurance coverage and enroll in the Family Planning Only Services Program.

Family Planning Only Services

Covered Services

The following family planning related services may be covered if provided at an initial or annual office visit::

- Contraceptive services and supplies. Such as birth control pills and condoms, etc. A prescription from a doctor or nurse practitioner is required.
- Natural family planning supplies.
- Prescriptions for family planning-related contraceptive supplies.
- Tests and treatment for STDs/STIs including chlamydia, herpes, gonorrhea and syphilis as well as certain other lab tests.
- Routine preventive primary services that are related to family planning.

Note: Only certain services are covered under this program. For example, mammograms, hysterectomies, inpatient hospital services and vaccinations are not covered by the Family Planning Only Services Program.

How to Apply for or Learn More About Family Planning Only Services

You can apply online any time at ACCESS.wi.gov.

If you need to receive family planning services before you can complete your full application, you may be able to temporarily enroll in the Family Planning Only Services Program. For more information about how to temporarily enroll, go to dhs.wi.gov/forwardhealth/fpos-ee.htm.

Note: If you are able to enroll in the Family Planning Only Services Program, you may be able to enroll in Badger Care Plus which covers more than family planning services. If you become enrolled in Badger Care Plus, you will no longer be enrolled in the Family Planning Only Services Program.

Getting Services

A short period of time after enrolling in the Family Planning Only Services Program, you will get a plastic ForwardHealth card.

Note: If you were previously enrolled in Family Planning Only Services, BadgerCare Plus or Medicaid, you were sent a ForwardHealth card. If you still have that ForwardHealth card, you should use that card. If you no longer have that ForwardHealth card, you can request a new one by calling Member Services at 1-800-362-3002 or online at ACCESS.wi.gov.

Take your ForwardHealth card with you when you have a family planning-related appointment or when you pick up a prescription for contraceptive supplies from the pharmacy. You need to show your card each time you get services through the Family Planning Only Services Program.

You need to tell your health care provider you have Family Planning Only Services coverage before you get services. Your provider must tell you if a service is not covered. If your provider tells you a service is not covered and you still choose to get the service, you will have to pay for it.

If you need services that your family planning provider is unable to provide, your provider will refer you to a provider who can provide those services. You may also be referred to your local community health center or Federally Qualified Health Center, if you need any follow up care not covered under the Family Planning Only Services Program. If you have questions about getting a referral, ask your family planning provider. To find a list of free or low cost clinics go to dhs.wi.gov/forwardhealth/clinics.htm.

Federal law allows members to choose their provider, including physician and family planning clinics, for family planning services and supplies. This means you can go to any family planning clinic that will accept your ForwardHealth card.

Confidentiality

If you apply for or get coverage from Family Planning Only Services, you have the following protections:

- Written information can be sent to an address other than your home address.
- If you are under 18 years of age, you will not be referred to the child support agency.
- The agency will not contact parents or other caretakers.
